



## Pollie Reasor Davis

April 14, 1912 - March 21, 2013

Appalachia, Virginia

Pollie Reasor Davis, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jesse Reasor, was born in Thomasville, Alabama on April 14, 1912. She answered God's call on March 21, 2013. The Reasor family moved to Southwest Virginia in 1919 as part of an African-American migration during the depression era, seeking a better life in the coal mines. Pollie was an active member of Macedonia Baptist Church in Appalachia, VA for 75 years serving as a Choir member, Sunday school, and Victory Club officer, and mother-of-church. She gave volunteer time to the PTA and served as a minister's assistance in churches, nursing facilities, and as a home visitor. Pollie often entered community activities, such as Coalfield Days and the Southwest Virginia Senior Citizens Contest Competition.

She leaves to remember her, a son Charles Henry Davis (Cincinnati, OH); niece(raised as a daughter), Arlonda Keaton (Midlothian, VA); eight nieces; Jessie Reasor Zander (Tucson, AZ), Ida Reasor Neeley (Detroit, MI), Barbara L. Reasor Hollinger (White Plains, NY), Corine Reasor and Mary Reasor (Cleveland, OH), Semonia V. Ward (Statesville, NC), Cherrie Pennington (Chicago, IL), Cherrie Nelson (Chicago, IL) two nephews; Emmanuel Reasor, Jr. (Connecticut) and James Reasor (Cleveland, OH), two grandsons, Ronnie Davis (Woodridge, VA) and Paul Davis (Pembroke, FL).

She is preceded in death by husband, Henry Davis, brothers; Jesse Reasor and Emmanuel Reasor, mother Cherrie Reasor and grandson Pete Davis.
